

COME TO SCHOOL ON TIME DAILY!

'Chronic lateness eventually takes its toll on a child's overall educational experience. According to the national initiative Attendance Works, missing just 10 percent of the school year in the early grades causes many students to struggle in elementary school, and lateness in later grades is associated with increased failure and dropout rates." (Effects of Tardiness on Your Child's Education by Rachel Pancare, StudioD) What does this all mean? The Cherrywood staff wants our students to come to school ON TIME EVERY DAY ready to learn, succeed and achieve. We need your help in getting your child here on time. Parents with students with excessive tardies will be notified. If your child is sick and unable to attend school, please make sure to call the school Office (408) 923-1915. When parents don't call, students will be marked unexcused. Too many unexcused absences and tardies will result in a truancy note. Let's reduce the number of UNEXCUSED absences and tardies. Also, students are rewarded with music on the playground when there are 0 tardies for the day. Let's make this the goal for the new trimester. So far, we have not had a tardy free day yet.
