
We raised our student's awareness of drugs by having different theme activities all week long last week.



TRAFFIC CONCERNS

One of the ways parents, grandparents, and childcare providers can help to ensure the safety of our students and school community members is to follow traffic laws.

Please respect the Staff and teacher advisors who are assigned to help students and parents safely cross the street. Please respect the homes and private property of people who live near the school by not parking in their driveways. If you are late to drop off or pick up a child, find a legal parking spot before coming to the school Office. Private driveways or the red curbs marking the fire lane in front of the school are NOT



parking spaces. The white curb is only for dropping/picking up. If you park and leave your vehicle in an illegal spot, you may get a ticket. Our parking lot is for staff ONLY. Remember, children learn the behavior we model. If we want them to follow rules and procedures, we need to practice that behavior ourselves

The State of California expects that each school age student will be in school on school days. If you must take your child out of school for a span of 5-10 days, you may request an independent study. The independent study is a contract with the school to complete all of the missed work while the student is away from school. It's the parent's responsibility to make sure all work is completed to grade level expectations. All independent study requests must be made at least 2 weeks in advance of the absences. The contract is signed by the parent, student, teacher and the principal. The principal will review the contract and decide if approval is going to be given based on these factors: attendance patterns, academic achievement, behavior and previous independent study requests. However, in order for us to educate your child best, we strongly believe that students need to be in class and highly discourage you from being out of school for an extended amount of time.

PARTY TREATS & CLASS CELEBRATIONS

Class parties or celebrations, especially during the holidays, shall be limited to no more than one party per class per month. For party treat, only safe, non-food treats are permitted; enough for all students in class. Bottled water is the only beverage to be served in the party.


